
I was thinking the other night about odd characters that I have met in my life and why I remember them.

Whilst in the RAF for National Service, a corporal once said to me, "You want to be in a job where you don't know where you are, then you'll know where you are!"

I was in charge of 40 youngsters on an education coach trip abroad. Our last day and night was spent in Lourdes, at the Hôtel Angelic. When I booked I was told that the children were to be three to a bed. I instantly refused to accept this and, with much reluctance from the hotel management, we were given camp beds for friends to share. The lady owner of the hotel looked me in the eye and said sternly, "You come here to pray, not to complain."

We had a new headmaster at one time in my teaching career, who was famous



for saying, "My door is open, but my mind is closed."

We always had weekly staff meetings and some newly arrived staff used to think that they were full of good ideas. One well respected senior member of staff used to come up with the expression, "If it is new, we have tried it!"

We once had an oddball metalwork master who, although an accomplished artist, would only do self-portraits! One day he thought he would play a prank on the staff before morning assembly. He put on a William Hartnell mask he had obtained from a fancy dress store. (*For younger readers, Hartnell played the original Dr Who from 1963 to 1966.*)

Unfortunately our oddball teacher had picked the day when the local MP was visiting. This teacher arrived at the school's front door just as our headmaster was ushering the distinguished guest towards the assembly hall. He threw the door open, knocked the MP off his feet and exclaimed, "Is this Earth?" Not long after he left to become a driving instructor!

On a school trip we flew to Naples and from there went by coach to a village near Sorrento, which we used as our base. On the second day I hired another bus to take us down the famous Corniche Run - a magnificent journey along the coast to Amalfi, where the patron of Italian fishermen (and Scotland) Saint Andrew is buried in the church.

On the journey we came to a small town called Positano (*pop. 4000*) where the driver told us Sophia Loren lived, but we could see a much better view of her property on our return as the road did a graceful curve around the dwellings.

The children were really interested and asked the driver to slow down as we approached the gates of her property and they saw there were inscriptions across the double gates. The driver did as he was bidden, and was fascinated to see lots of the children busy writing down the inscriptions. He asked them why and they told him that they wanted to write to Sophia Loren, using the information that they had so studiously recorded. The driver burst out laughing, and called me over. He confidentially told me that what they were writing down basically was the Italian for "Beware of the Dog" and he didn't have the heart to disillusion them!

Life certainly wasn't dull in my role as housemaster, especially when I was given extra responsibilities, namely as the master in charge of foreign travel.

Mike has a phenomenal memory and a vast resource of stories. When he came in to have his photo taken, he happened to mention this: as a young man he witnessed a girl being run down by a car. The front wheel was on her neck. He summoned all his strength and managed to lift the car away, saving the girl's life. He tore two shoulder muscles, which still give trouble.
